



Raleigh, May 30. - Political observers today predicted a comparatively light vote for Saturday's bond issue balloting.

On Saturday, Tar Heels will decide on the question of issuing \$200 million in bonds to improve rural roads and on \$25 million in bonds to aid counties in building schools. A one cent increase in the gasoline. tax hinges on approval of the road bonds.


As the time for voting drew near, Governor Scott continued his drive to win support for the bond issues. Friday, the Governor plans to fly back to Raleigh for a statewide radio broadcast at 7:30 p. m., closing the school and road campaign. On Saturday, he will go home to Haw River to vote.
