

### **DEBRIS IN STREAMS CAUSES SHORTAGE** IN WATER SUPPLY

Heavy rains which have soaked this section at intermittent periods. throughout the month of August. came to a climax last Sunday. Lakes, rivers and creeks were swollen beyond their banks. By early afternoon Mackey's Creek and Clear Creek were flowing across highway 70, the Catawba river had risen to the top of the arches underneath the bridge and bottom lands bordering "Morgan stretch" were flooded. Later in the afternoon the water poured across the highway.
