- 2 cups walnuts chopped 2 cups cooked rice
- 2 tablespoons bacon fat 1-4 cups chopped pimiento
- 3 tablespoons flour 1 cup milk
- 1-2 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- 1 egg beaten
- 1 1-2 teaspoon salt


