Famous nurse. At an early age she manifested a keen interest in suffering humanity, and from philanthropic motives she visited the chief military hospitals in Europe, and studied the chief nursing systems. During the Crimean War the hospital accommodations were found to be very defective and she promptly volunteered to organize a select band of nurses at Scutari. The offer was accepted by the War Office, and within a week she was on her way to the East, where rendered invaluable service to the sick and wounded by her incessant labors in nursing and hospital reform.
 The strain, both mental and physical, which this work demanded, permanently injured her health; yet notwithstanding her confinement to a sick room, she has continued to give her experience in the interest of hospital reform, and for this purpose she was consulted during the Civil War and the Franco-American War.

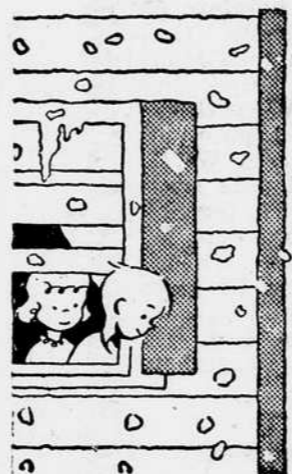

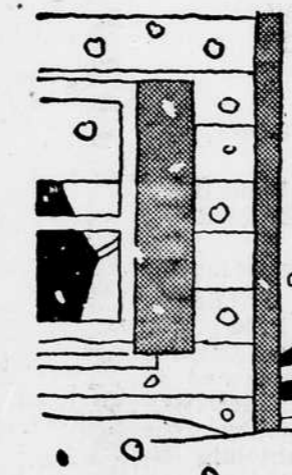
