The system will be admistered by the same board which operates the teachers retirement plan in the state and will operate in the same way; employee and the county will contribute to the fund; cost to the county will be about \$8,000 per year The retirement plan provides for consistent saving,s supplemented by county conributions which together provide some security at retirement age.
