

**GOLF AND SHOOTING!**

**Full List of The Stated Fixtures and Events for Season.**

**The Program is an Unusually Elaborate One and the Trophies are Beauties.**

The seasons program of stated golf and trap shooting events is an unusually attractive one, and the dates and events announced below, are printed for the convenience not only of the participants but others who will be interested to watch the events as well.

**Stated Golf Fixtures.**

The full schedule of stated handicap golf fixtures and a list of the trophies is as follows:

January 31st—Men's Inauguration Open Tournament. Cups for best net and best gross scores.

Feb. 7th—Men's Open Tournament. Cup for two best scores.

Women's Open Handicap Tournament. Cup for best net score.

Feb. 14th—Men's Open Tournament for Holly Inn Cup, offered for the best net score. Second prize for next best net score.

Feb. 21st—Tournament for the Presbrey Cup. Open to any man or woman who has never played eighteen consecutive holes in less than 100.

Feb. 28th—Men's Open Tournament for the Priest Cups, offered for the best net and the best gross scores.

Unique Tournament. Eighteen holes for the Harvard Cup. Competitors in this tournament can use but two clubs; the putter and driver. The putter must be used for strokes except putting, and the driver for putting only. Open to men and women.

Mar. 7th—Men's Tournament for the Berkshire Cup. Open to any player who has never played golf prior to January 1st 1902.

Women's Open Handicap for the Tufts Cup offered, one each for the best net and best gross scores.

March 14th—Men's Open Tournament, for two handsome trophies: The Carolina Cup for the best net score, and a cup for the best gross score.

Mar. 21st—Consolation Tournament, for the Pinehurst Cup. Open to all who have taken part in one or more previous tournaments, but have won no prizes.

Mar. 28th—Grand Annual Match and Medal Play Tournament, open to all golfers in the United States, for the United North and South Championship Cup. This is a magnificent Sterling trophy, made by the Gorham Manufacturing Co., and becomes the property of the winner. Magnificent Sterling Gorham Cups are also offered for the runner up, and the best net and best gross scores. This Tournament is also open to women. Magnificent Gorham Sterling Cup for the best net score, and a handsome Gorham Cup for the best gross score.

U. S. Golf Association rules to govern all tournaments. No player eligible to entry who has not been a guest at Pinehurst for three days or more prior to date of tournament, except by concurrence of Handicap Committee. No competitor can take both the gross and net score cups.

In addition to the series of stated tournaments there will be many informal

events; putting, driving and approaching contests, special matches and tournaments.

**Trap Shooting Events.**

The program of stated handicap trap shooting events and a list of the trophies is as follows:

Feb. 4—Twenty-five single bird shoot for the Holly Inn cup.

Feb. 11—Twenty-five single bird shoot for the "Outing" trophy.

Feb. 18—Fifteen single and twenty double bird shoot for the Priest cup.

Feb. 25—Fifty single bird shoot for the Carolina cup.

Mar. 4—Fifty single and twenty double bird shoot for the Tufts cup.

Mar. 11—Fifty single and twenty double bird shoot for the Championship (1903) cup.

Mar. 18—Fifty single bird shoot for the "Recreation" trophy.

Mar. 25—Fifty single bird shoot for the Presbrey cup.

The tournaments are open to all who have been guests at any of the Pinehurst hotels or cottages for three days or more prior to the tournament. The shooting grounds are always open for the use of guests. No charge is made except for the birds thrown.

In addition to the set program there will be many additional or special events.

**Sunday Services.**

Sunday services will be held in the Village Hall, each Sunday as follows:

UNION—Sunday mornings at eleven o'clock, *except* the second Sunday of the month, when the service will be held at four in the afternoon. Rev. D. W. Fox, officiating.

PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL—Sunday afternoons at four o'clock, *except* on the second Sunday of the month when communion services will be held at 10 o'clock in the morning, followed by morning prayer with sermon, at eleven. Rev. H. T. Gregory, officiating.

Two-thirds of the offerings received go to the officiating clergymen and the balance to the Pinehurst Educational Fund.
