The Standard American target at a fifty yard range is mostly used, but this seasons program will be varied by the use of the 20 yard target, the elliptical target and possibly the German ring.

March 16—Mixed doubles for the St. Patrick's-day cup.

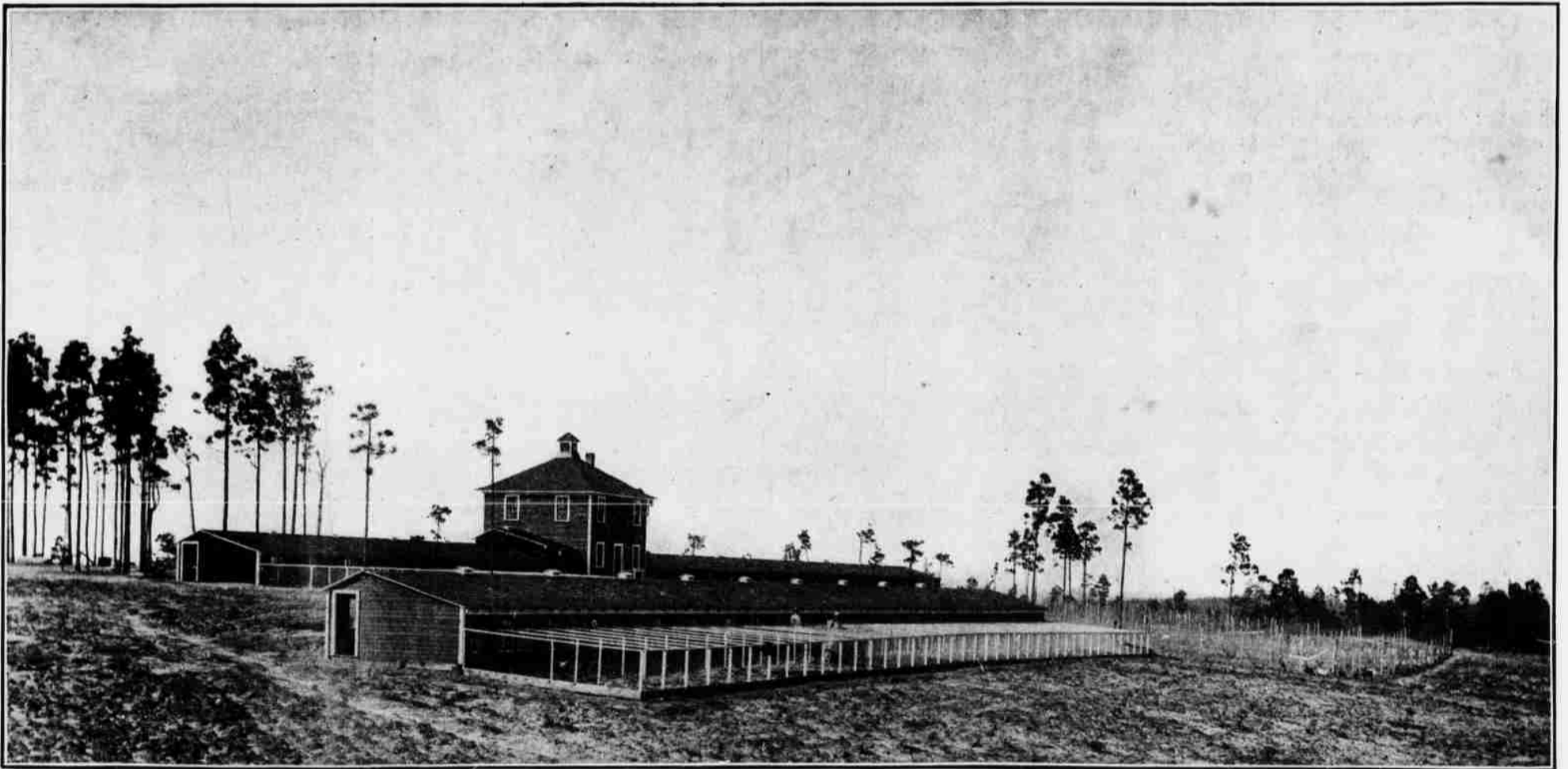
March 22, 23, 24—Pinehurst Championship; gold medals for men's singles, women's singles and mixed doubles.

THE MAIN BUILDINGS OF THE POULTRY FARM.

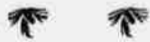
