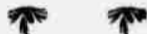
Mr. Boyd Decker, Mr. Charles A. Shafer and Mr. Horace B. Day, of New York, are here to enjoy the shooting.

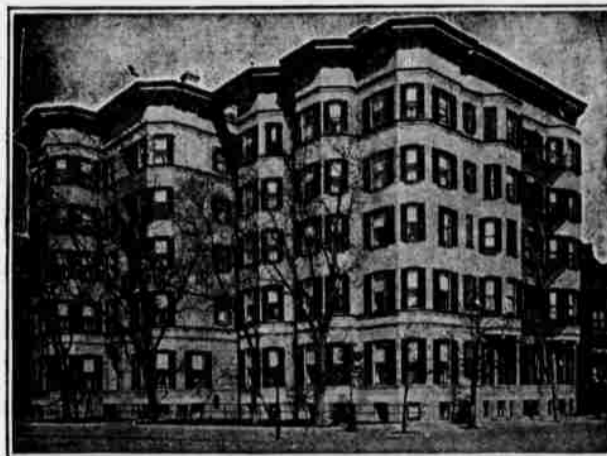
