Golfers are Assembling Early for the Inauguration Tournament.

Event Will Occupy Whole of Coming Week and Many Prominent Amateurs Will Compete.



THE first of the great company of golfers which will assemble here for the annual Midwinter or Inauguration Tournament which will occupy the whole of the coming week, is on hand. Large delegations are expected today, and every train, up to Tuesday night, will swell the number.

Play begins Monday with the qualifying round of the International Tournament for Advertising Men, which will continue through Tuesday. The Midwinter tournament begins Wednesday morning with a qualification round and continues through Saturday, ending with a medal play handicap.

## SATURDAY'S GOLF TOURNEY

F. E. Belden and J. H. Clapp are Winners of New Year's Cups.

Fight for Gross Score Trophy was a Close One—Field Finishes Below One Hundred.



SATURDAY'S eighteen hole medal play handicap for the New Year's cups resulted in a close contest for the gross score cups, J. H. Clapp, of Washington, winning with 91, only two strokes in the lead of G. Lee Knight, of Philadelphia, and L. R. Fuller, of New York, who scored 93 each. A. E. Lard, of Washington, the scratch man, scored 95.

F. E. Belden, of Hartford, playing with a handicap of 22, took the net score cup with 79, leading his nearest opponent 7 strokes. The entire field finished under 100.
