

**PRESBREY WINS GOLD MEDAL**

**Leads in Advertising Men's Qualification by Single Stroke.**

**Round was a Hole for Hole Battle From Start to Finish, and Closest Ever Played Here.**



HE contest for the gold medal offered for the best score in the qualification round of the Advertising Men's International Golf Tournament, was the closest ever played on the local links; a hole for hole battle from start to finish, Frank Presbrey, of New York, winning by a single stroke, from William C. Freeman, of Montclair, with a card of ninety-two, and close after them came James G. Batterson, of New York, with ninety-five.

**CLOSE SCORES THROUGHOUT.**

The closeness of the play throughout will be seen by an examination of the detailed scores, the entire field finishing between ninety-two and one hundred and nineteen. The first division varied only eight, the second only five, the third only three, the fourth five, and the last three points from the lowest man to the highest. Never before has a field here been more evenly matched.

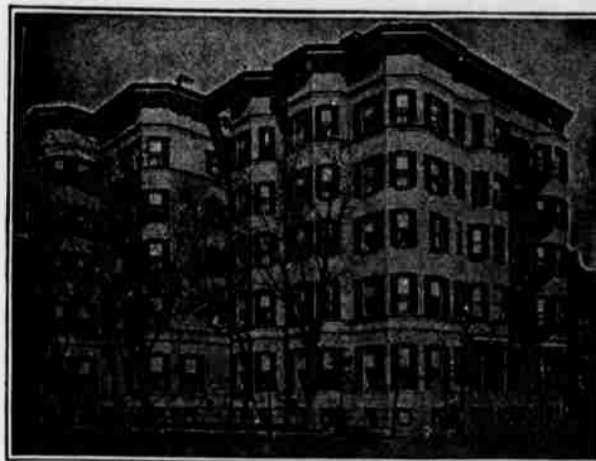
