Southern Pines Nine Defeats Village Team in Red-Hot Contest.

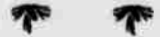
Score Even at End of Fifth Inning, but Visitors Found Ball for Five Winning Runs in Last Four.

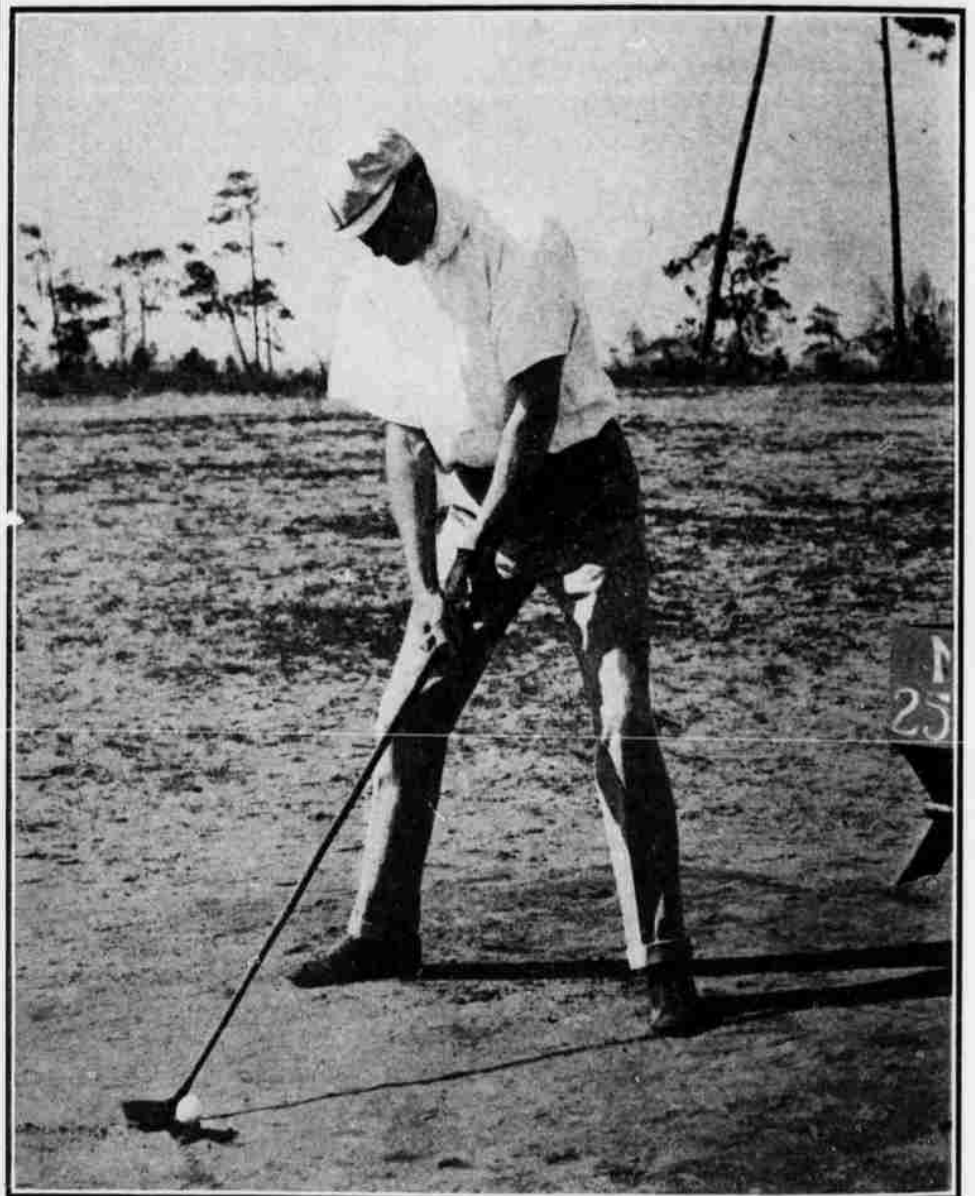
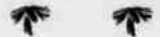
Progressive Hearts at The Holly.
