ANNUAL HANDICAP TOURNEY

C. E. Cameron and A. P. K. James Tie for Net Score Prize.

L. A. Hamilton Wins Gross Trophy With Eighty-four Card and Three Strokes Margin.

THE annual handicap of the Championship tournament drew a record field, its special feature being a tie for the first cup, between C. E. Cameron of Baltusrol, whose handicap was fourteen, and A. P. K. James of London, whose allowance was ten, Mr. Cameron winning the play-off.

The battle for the gold medal offered for the best gross score was a pretty one, L. A. Hamilton of Englewood, winning with a card of eighty-four and a margin of three strokes, Mr. James being his nearest opponent. W. K. Wood of the Homewood Club, winner of the amateur championship, was next with eighty-eight, and L. E. Wardwell of Megunticook, and Edwin A. Freeman of Montclair, tied for fourth position at eighty-nine. George E. Morse of the Rutland Country Club, and William C. Freeman of Montclair, made ninety each, and C. L. Becker of Woodland, ninety-two.

A high wind which made the putting greens "impossible" was responsible for the high scores.

DONALD ROSS THE WINNER

Leads Field by Four Strokes in Open Southern Championship.

Arthur H. Fenn Who Ties for Second With Alex Ross, Makes Fast Round of Seventy.

THE thirty-six hole open Southern championship or closing event of the United North and South tournament, was characterized by brilliant golf and close scores, a number of the amateurs who were prominent in the championship, participating.

Professional Donald J. Ross of the local and the Oakley Country Clubs, led the field with a record card of one hundred and forty-six, establishing a new record for the present course, doing the morning round in seventy-two and the afternoon in seventy-four.

Professionals Arthur H. Fenn of Palm Beach and Poland Spring, and Alex. Ross were only four strokes away and tied at one hundred and fifty each, with the rest of the field well up, L. E. Wardwell of the Megunticook Club, Maine, leading the amateurs and tying with Professional Jack Jolly at one hundred and fifty-two.

The sensational feature of the day's play was Mr. Fenn's fast morning round of seventy, the score out being remarkable in that it contained two twos and three fives, and a total of thirty-three.
