## MANY EXTRA HOLE CONTESTS

Match Play Rounds of the Annual Spring Tourney Very Fast.

Monster Field is Evenly Matched and Keen Play Rules Throughout All Divisions.



XTRA hole contests were the feature of the fourth annual spring tournament, and they ran through all divisions, from the first to the sev-

enth, for no field here has been more evenly matched. Naturally interest centered in the first division, but play was equally close in the others, notably the fourth, with two nineteen-hole matches in the semi-final round and very few matches throughout that were won with more liberal margins than "two and one."




