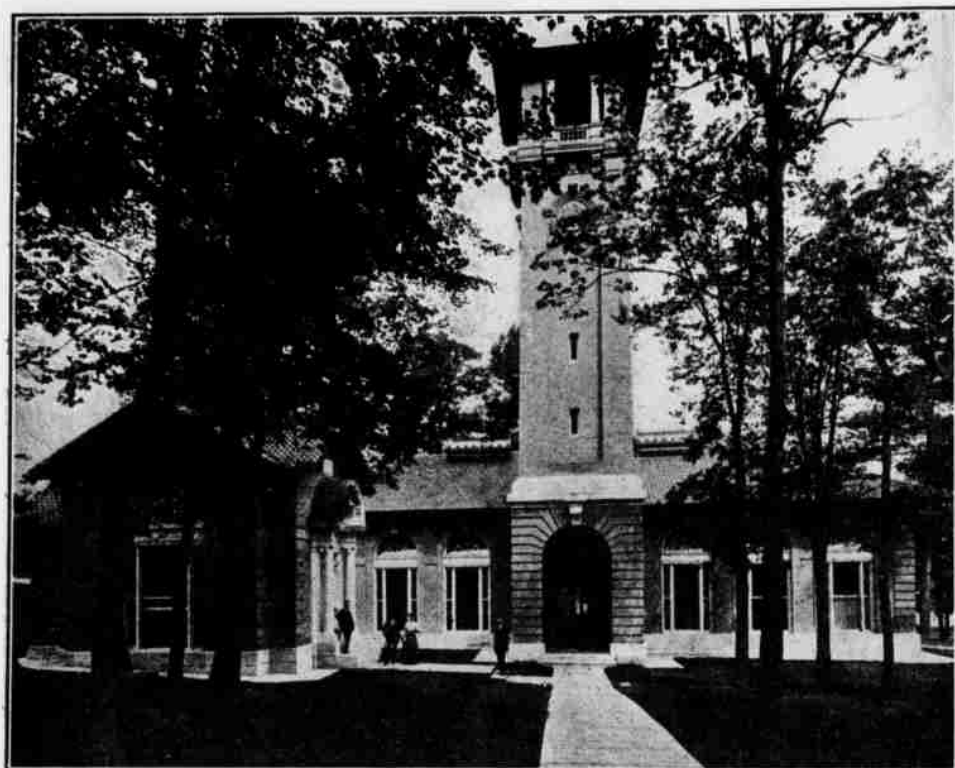

PRETTY RACE FOR MEDAL

Edwin A. Freeman Leads Big Field in Championship Qualification.

Scores Fast One Hundred and Fifty-Seven, Leading Crocker and Herreshoff Each a Stroke.



PRETTY race for the gold medal offered for the best score, was the feature of the thirty-six hole qualification round of the Championship tournament; Edwin A. Freeman of the Fox Hills Club, leading the big field with a fast one hundred and fifty-seven. Next in line came C. T. Crocker, Jr., of the Alpine Club, Fitchburg, a stroke away in one hundred and fifty-eight, with Fred Herreshoff of Garden City, third in one hundred and fifty-nine. No prettier trio of scores have ever been made here.
