



Although J. A. R. Elliot has been prominent in the trap-shooting world for nearly twenty years, his skill and personal popularity are still undimmed. In August, 1890, Elliott jumped into the first rank of trap shots by winning the Championship of America at Live Birds, though live bird shooting is more of a specialty of his than inanimate targets, he has made many remarkable scores at the latter.
