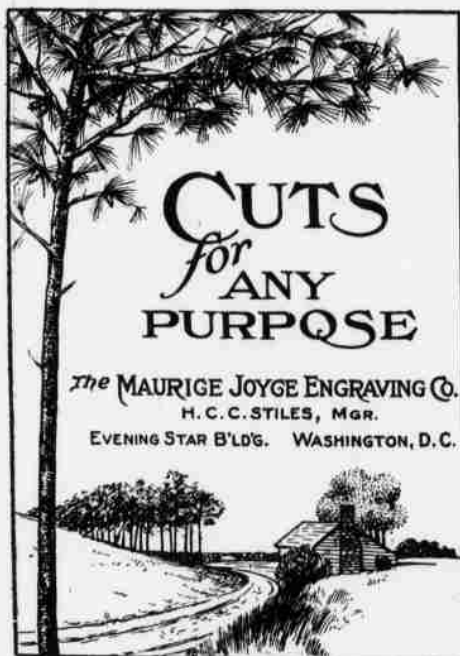

QUALIFICATION BY EIGHTS

Fifteen Divisions Provided for in Advertising Tourney

EIGHTY-THREE for L. A. Hamilton of Englewood, and eighty-four by J. P. Knapp of Garden City, captured the gross score qualification trophies in the Advertising Men's golf tournament;

W. E. Truesdell of New York, who tied with Mr. Knapp with drawing his gross and turning in his net card. A stroke further away were J. P. Gardner of Midlothian, L. W. Maxwell of Hinsdale and G. H. Barnes of Apawamis, bunched in a triple tie at eighty-five.

B. C. Andrews of Scarsdale, with a handicap of forty, and E. F. Clymer of Kokie, whose allowance was twenty-seven, led the handicap played in connection; Mr. Andrews winning first in the play-off. For the two remaining prizes W. H. Childs of Nassau (25), Mr. Truesdell (9), and C. F. Bacon of Brae Burn (20), tied at seventy-five; Mr. Childs winning third and Mr. Truesdell fourth in the play-off.
