Probable Assistant Secretary of State  
Widely Known Here

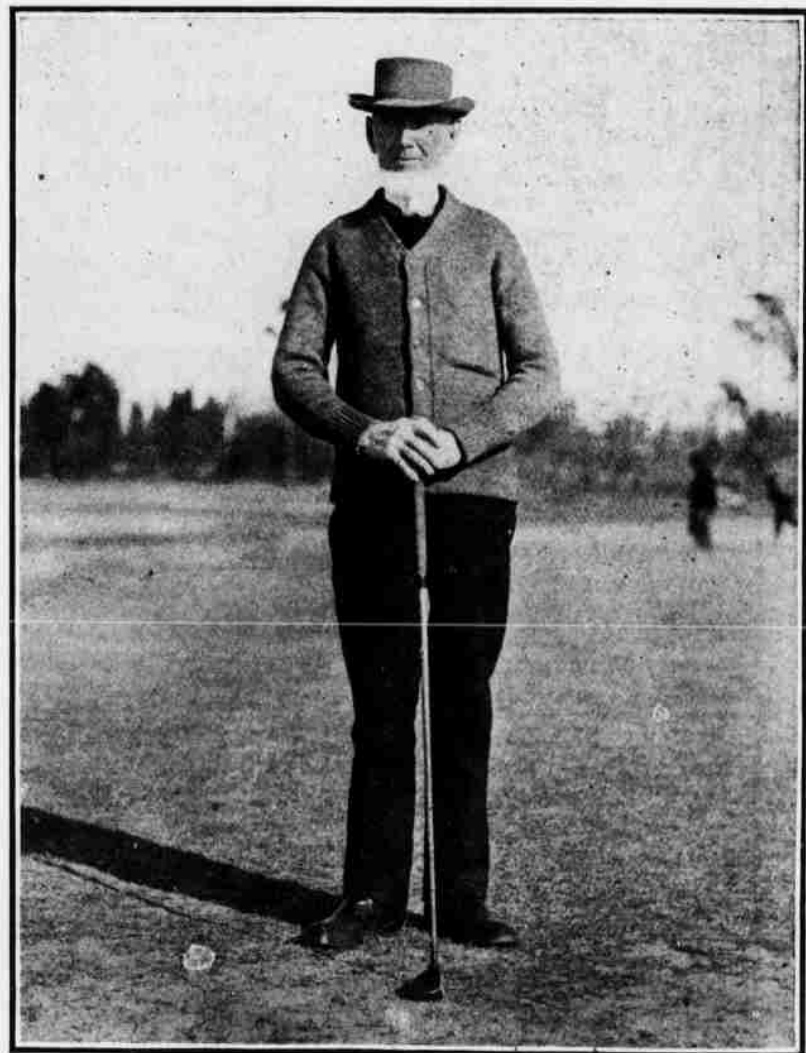


PLEASANTLY remembered as an annual visitor for many years is Professor John Bassett Moore. Not only within the Village but in the country-side roundabout did his delightful personality endear him to all with whom he came in contact.

Delaware was Secretary of State. He was appointed First Assistant Secretary of State by President McKinley in 1898, succeeding William L. Day, present Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, who had been promoted to be Secretary of State to succeed John Sherman. Prof. Moore was present in his official capacity in the White House at the signing of the peace treaty between the United States and Spain at the close of the Spanish-American war.

Information came to Washington today from reliable sources that Prof. John Bassett Moore of Columbia University is to be appointed Assistant Secretary of State. ¶ This information was a source of gratification to the trained diplomats in the State Department and in diplomatic circles generally, where Prof. Moore is known on account of his reputation as a writer and lecturer on international law.

Prof. Moore came to the State Department as Third Assistant Secretary of State in President Cleveland's first administration, when Thomas F. Bayard of

approved of the appointment of Prof. Moore. It is believed that one of the conditions under which Mr. Bryan has accepted the Secretaryship is that he be relieved as far as possible from the exacting detail work of the Department.

Prof. Moore's experience and knowledge of diplomacy will make him very useful to the new Administration, it is believed. He will succeed Huntington Wilson.
