the ruins of a Confederate cotton com- | NOT press, which was the first put up in this country. This was destroyed before the city was evacuated in January, 1865. There were miles of cotton wharves and also other wharves on which were naval stores, such as rosin and spirits of turpentine. Wilmington was in those days the busiest place in the Confederacy, thronged with people from all over the world, while fortunes were sometimes made in a month. Down at Smithville (now Southport), at the mouth of the river, lived the pilots who took the blockade-runners out and in between there and Nassau. These were always paid in gold, sometimes \$5000 for a round trip,
