

HANDICAPS IN MATCH PLAY

Competition in Advertising Tourney
Extends Through All Divisions



COMPETITION in the match play rounds of the Advertising Golf Tournament was by no means confined to the first division, which played from scratch. In all others, even the first division consolation, handicaps equalized the field, with the result that the majority of battles were carried to the seventeenth green, a goodly number to the last hole, and a few beyond it. The difference in handicaps was very small as a general rule, the same allowances as in the various handicaps, with the usual match play reduction, prevailing. ¶ All three courses were brought into use.
