WHITTEMORE AND FOWNES FIRST

They Lead with Low Medal Scores in St. Valentine's Qualification

Fownes of Oakmont, with cards of seventy-five and seventy-nine, headed the field of one hundred and fifty-seven contestants in the qualification round of the St. Valentine's golf tournament. In third position J. W. Watson of Merion made eighty-one with F. A. Martin of Ekwanok and W. H. Faust of Buffalo tied at eighty-two. Bunched in a quadruple tie at ninety were a quartet including Rev. T. A. Cheatham of Salisbury, who won in the play-off from T. B. Boyd of Bellerieve, C. B. Hudson of North Fork and P. S. Maclaughlin of Scarsdale. ¶ Play was on Number 2 course, and eight sixteens qualified under the Pinehurst system with a special division for the overflow. ¶ The scores:
