

tion of this tribe is in Oklahoma, and the lands are held in common, everything being under Government supervision. ¶ On the other hand it is the State which maintains the public schools, including the training school, for the so-called The se Croatans. The latter are considerably mixed by intermarriages with whites and in some cases with negroes, but intermarriage is now forbidden. There has been unlawful living in the past among them and whites and blacks, and the beauty of some of the Croatan women has made them the wives of men in states
