"Any person who becomes ineligible by reason of this bylaw may be reinstated by giving to the Executive Committee of this association satisfactory evidence of meriting such reinstatement. No occurrence prior to January 8, 1915, shall affect the status of any person who was in good standing as an amateur on said date."

As if to prevent arguments on the foregoing new rule, the Executive Committee has compiled what it defines as five distinct violations, as follows:

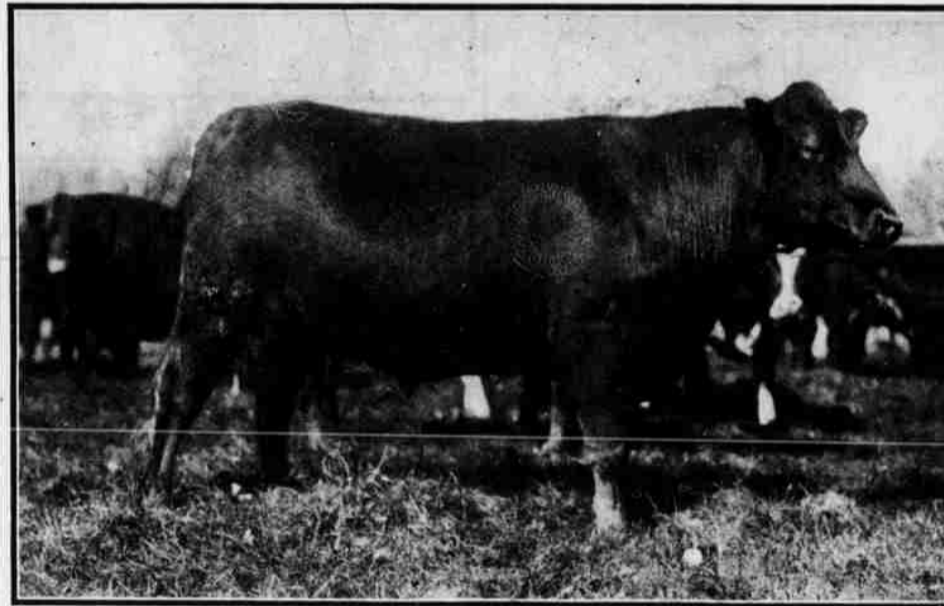
First. Playing or teaching the game of golf for pay. This includes accepting traveling or living expenses for playing over a course or for participating in a golf tournament, contest or exhibition.

Second. Personally making or repairing golf clubs, golf balls or other articles for pay.

Third. Serving, after reaching the age of sixteen, as caddie, caddie master or greenkeeper for hire.

Fourth. Lending one's name or likeness for the advertisement or sale of anything except as a dealer, manufacturer or inventor thereof in the usual course of business.

Fifth. Permitting one's name to be advertised or published for pay as the author of books or articles on golf which one is not actually the author.

AMATEUR STATUS DEFINED

National Association Issues Rules Covering Doubtful Points

All doubt as to what constitutes an amateur golfer was dispelled when Howard F. Whitney, secretary of the United States Golf Association, gave out the new rules covering the point, which has been the subject of comment for a year.

"An amateur golfer is one who has not accepted, directly or indirectly, any fee, gratuity, money or its equivalent as a consideration for the performance of any act or service arising in connection with the game of golf, and who is not or has not been a professional in any other branch of athletics. Provided, however, that the above shall not apply to writing, editing or publishing articles, magazines or books on golf, or to laying out, constructing, supervising or giving advice concerning the layout, construction or upkeep of a golf course or any part thereof.
