Derby of the Sandhills Presides at Conclave of the Allied Towns

Board of Trade Banquet at Highland Pines Inn Enriched by the Harmony of Timberose Minstrels



LISTEN to John R. McQueen, for years a voice crying in the wilderness, teacher and leader of the country children, a practical student of the needs and the opportunities of the people of the Sandhills, whose efforts against great odds have gone far towards building the schools and the instruction to which every citizen of the United States is really entitled without the life devotion of a private prophet.

The dark days have passed. In the big dining room of the Highland Pines Inn he is addressing an audience of the chieftains of the allied towns—the men of thought and action for forty miles around. Fifty cars are parked in the circle before the hostelry, and there is an air of power and well being auguring well for the future of this country. The community council, the Board of Trade, is assembled to make merry, to greet each other and the New Year, and to plan the never ending campaign to put the Sandhills on the map, and to make the map proud of the addition.

DERBY'S CREED

Roger Derby is in the chair. He is not satisfied with the stirring beginning his work here has developed.
