Tin Whistle Match. Rumsey Maintains His Victorious Lead. Wins Play-off in Medal Round

This is the sort of thing that puts a reporter up a tree. The Tin Whistle stage a team match every year that shakes the club to its foundations, so keen is the rivalry and bitter the contest. And yet the event eludes all description. For the cohorts were lined up in two fields, distinguished by the Crimson and the Blue, and made a day's furious play upon the three point system to establish the supremacy. Result. That the historic field and the mighty combat leaves no more to be said than that after all records were smashed and many a bloodless onset was settled only with the coming of the moon, the Blue Team had walloped the Reds beyond all debate, on the ratio of 49 to 38.

RUMSEY LEADS THE FIELD

But incidentally there was a handsome reward in the locker for the best ball over number one with club handicaps. And here it was that J. D. C. Rumsey shone. He cracked out a ninety-seven, which translated in the handicap code read 73. This was too fast for every one but F. S. Pusey, whose 17 leeway brought him in at the same figure. T. R. Towle pushed in only one lick behind, just ahead of the press that recorded 75s—B. V. Covert, S. Y. Ramage, C. M. Slaton and Robert Foote.

This called for a play-off. And in this Rumsey was in no wise to be denied. He demonstrated that his card had little of the element of luck in it by repeating his score to a fraction, and coming back with another 73 net. Pusey could not stand the pace. He made a 97 also. But his allowance being only 17 he fell seven strokes behind the needful, and yielded the palm with good grace.

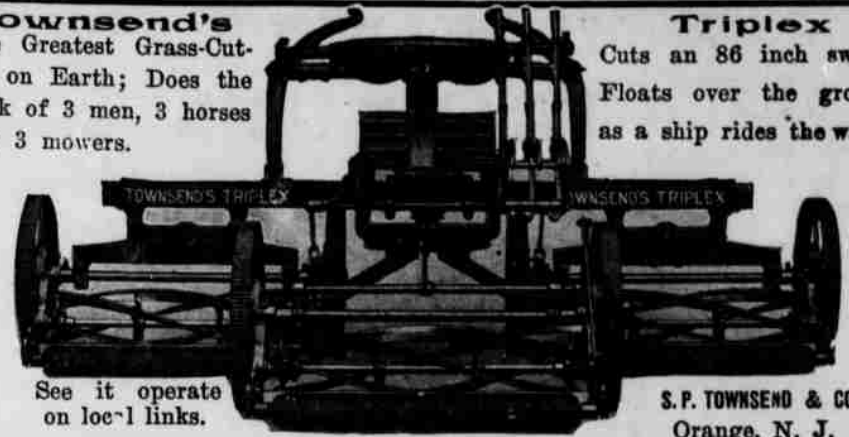
