## The Second Match Round

The Second Match Round was play-

73, which Armstrong immediately there-  
after matched with a 73 of his own, in  
a four ball match played on the same  
course.

pose Armstrong in the semi-finals by  
defeating C. F. Watson, Jr., by 3 and  
2. Hamilton started out on his road to  
victory with a rush. He lost four of  
the first five holes.

fifth but managed to square things by  
the time the 18th was reached.
