The Statzell cottage was opened up for the season the second week in December at Pinehurst and this veteran resident, as a matter of course, wasted no time at all unpacking his clubs and shaking them out over the links.

As head of quite a remarkable golfing family, there is an interesting story on the all-around athletic proclivities of his sturdy clan.

Just before he left for the South, Mr. Statzell, for instance, entertained the members of the Penn Charter interacademic championship football team. And in his paternal eye beamed the proud light of pride in the fact that it also meant toasting one grandson, Harlan Statzell, captain of the team, and another "Bob" Statzell, captain-elect of the team, the first time in the history of this expert schoolboy grid team that one brother had ever succeeded another to leadership. Both boys were chosen for positions on the Philadelphia all-academic team this year.
