their opponents a three-goal handicap.

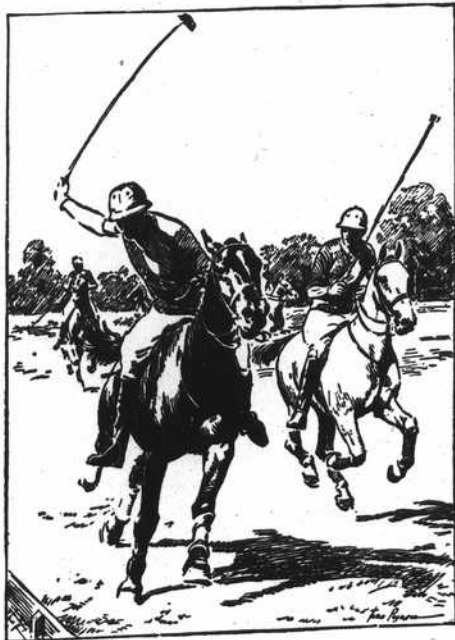
A team from Camden, South Carolina, will play the
