

TENNIS STARS HERE

Greatest Lineup of Stars Ever to Compete in Pinehurst in North and South

HEADING the classiest field of tennis stars ever to participate in a Pinehurst tournament, George Lott, Jr., of Chicago, third ranking player of the United States, will defend his title in the eleventh annual United North and South tennis tournament which will get under way this coming Monday on the championship courts of the Pinehurst Country Club. Entries continue to pour in, and the field will rank high in quantity as in quality.

The tournament will also bring John F. Hennessey of Indianapolis, Wilmer Allison of Austin, Texas, George Van Ryn of Orange, N. J., and Fritz Mercur of Harrisburg, Pa., to Pinehurst. They, with Lott, stand at the top of the American tennis ranking list, and it is expected that the championship game to be displayed here next week will provide plenty of interest and excitement for the large gallery which is sure to be on hand.

Other top-notchers now here who must be included in the brilliant field are Tamio Abe, stellar performer of last year's Davis Cup team from Japan, and his present partner, S. Onda, of Philadelphia, A. L. Bruneau, Lou Daly, Beals Wright, F. C. Baggs, R. L. Baggs, S. Howard Voshell, and G. Carlton Shafer of New York City, Percy Kynaston of Rockville Center, N. Y., Gilbert Hall of Orange, N. J., and Fred Otis of Providence, R. I.

Robert Crosland, lanky tennis ace of Charlotte, N. C., and Teddy Burwell, junior boys' champion of Charlotte, will also be on hand to furnish plenty of opposition to the more notable players. Crosland, who made a clean sweep of the Mid-South tennis tournament last fall on the local courts, is probably the outstanding North Carolinian who is participating.

The lineup of women stars is equally interesting, and includes many of the outstanding women players of the East. Among those who are competing are Miss Ann Page, Miss Dorothy Andrus and Mrs. Aimee Lamme of New York City, Miss Marjorie Sachs, Miss Marion Morss, Mrs. Ruth Shedden, Miss Dorothy Blodgett and Miss Clara Greenspan of Boston, Miss Virginia Hilleary and Miss Helen Lockhorn of Philadelphia.

Representatives of the University of North Carolina tennis team will have several representatives in the competition, and Hugh Lefler of North Carolina State College and Grady Craven Frank of Duke University are also expected.
