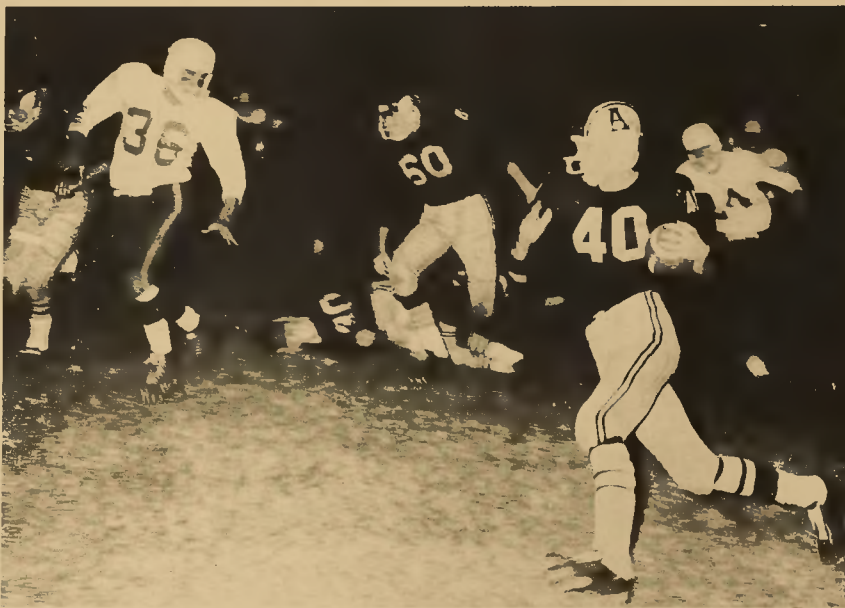

ROANOKE RAPIDS — A free basketball exhibition featuring the personal appearance of Rod Hundley, former West Virginia University and All-America Star will be held at T. N. Davis Recreation Center here on Wednesday night, October 20 at 7:30 p.m.

The purpose of the exhibition is to promote more interest in basketball to simplify teaching methods so that younger players, as well as seasoned veterans, can derive the most out of the game. Hundley, a six-year player with the Los Angeles Lakers and two-time member of NBA All-Star Teams, will demonstrate and explain basketball in detail, as well as passing, dribbling, pivoting, offense and defense. He will also give a discourse on rules and answer questions on rule interpretations.
