VOTE Yes



- to approve quotas on peanut crops for the next three years. If $\frac{2}{3}$ of the growers approve they will be eligible for support prices as long as they meet their quota. If $\frac{2}{3}$ do not approve—parity will drop to 50% for those who do not comply with their quota.

- to approve the continuation of cotton marketing quotas in 1966. If $\frac{2}{3}$ voting approve, full income support will be available to growers who comply with their farm allotments.

- Under the 1965 Act, if passed, a farmer may sell his allotment without selling his land or may lease it up to four years. He may also release it or place it in a cropland adjustment program for five to ten years.

- to approve the continuation of a 15c a bale assessment for the continued program of the North Carolina Cotton Promotion Association for three more years. Used for research and development, legislative defense and action, quality and marketing improvement and public relations.
