We were sorry to hear of Mrs. Henry Covington suffering with rheumatism. Hope she will soon be better.

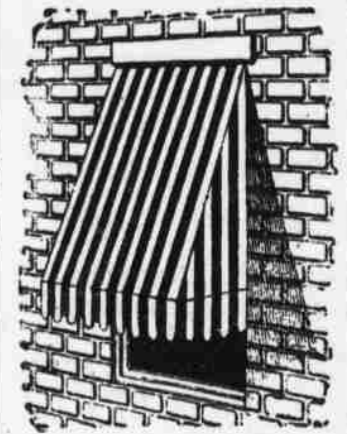
The Club met with Mr. H. A. Haywood's daughters at his house last Friday.
