PUBLICATION OF BOND ORDINANCE.

NORTH CAROLINA, Richmond County.

"The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Rockingham do enact:

"1. That bonds in the amount of \$12,500.00 shall be issued for the purpose of purchasing a fire truck and accessories, and in order to create a sinking fund for the retirement of said bonds and for the payment of the interest on same, a tax sufficient for that purpose shall be annually levied and collected during the time that said bonds are to run."
"2. That a statement of the debt of the said Town of Rockingham has been filed with the Clerk of the said Town pursuant to Sec. 2943 of the Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, and is open to public inspection, showing the average assessed valuation of the property subject to taxation by the said Town of Rockingham for the three years in which taxes were last levied to be \$4,171,760.00, and that the amount of the net debt of the said Town of Rockingham outstanding, authorized or to be authorized, is \$141,335.85."
"3. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage."
"4. That the bonds to be issued under and by virtue of this ordinance shall be used to pay for the fire truck and accessories, the probable period of usefulness of which is ten years; that the bonds to be issued hereunder shall mature on the 5th day of October, 1931; that the said bonds shall be due and payable as follows: On October 5th, 1924, \$1,000.00; on October 1, 1925, \$1,000.00; on October 5th, 1926, \$1,000.00; on October 5th, 1927, \$1,000.00; on October 5th, 1928, \$2,000.00; on October 5th, 1929, \$2,000.00; on October 5th, 1930, \$2,000.00; and on October 5th, 1931, \$2,500.00; that the said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, the principal and interest to be due and payable at the Bank of Rockingham in the Town of Rockingham, North Carolina, the first installment of interest is to be due and payable on the 5th day of April, 1922, and the second installment of interest is to be due and payable on the 5th day of October, 1922, and so on semi-annually so long as said bonds run."

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 5th day of August, 1921, and was first published on the 25th day of August, 1921. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
