The above in brief gives the result of the election held Tuesday. The POST-DISPATCH has on this page the vote by precincts, and the vote for each election since 1916.

Despite the rain that fell practically all day, a fairly large vote was polled. Two years ago the Republicans polled 1071 votes and the Democrats 3412. This year the Republicans polled 228 for sheriff and the Democrats 2495, making the majority (for Sheriff) 2267. Thus it is seen that the Democratic majority Tuesday was larger in proportion than the majority of two years ago.

The Republican defense simply crumpled (to use a football expression) and the Democracy

 Rockingham High's Soundly Trounced Hamlet Highs Last Friday Here 38-0. Banquet Tendered Rockingham and Hamlet Teams That Night. Rockingham Plays Fayetteville at Pinehurst Tomorrow (Friday) at 3 O'clock.

Rockingham advanced a notch in the University eliminations on last Friday, Nov. 3rd, 1922, when the local huskies soundly defeated the Hamlet high on the new Rockingham football field by score of 38-0. The score last year, it will be recalled, was 21-0.

Rockingham is now placed against the strong Fayetteville team in the second stage of the eliminations. This game will be played on neutral ground—Pinehurst—tomorrow, 10th, at 3 o'clock. It is hoped our folks will attend and give these boys their loyal support. Should Rockingham defeat Fayetteville, then our boys would move a step
