to give a majority against Burgin—27 for Jones to 18 for Burgin; whereas it gave Bob Reynolds 37 and Jonas 15.

In brief, it was a whale of a small county and district-wide vote. The folks simply stayed at home. And considering the size of the vote, the Burgin majority is all the more pleasing to his supporters.

Vote in the Nation.

The vote in the Nation leaned heavily towards the Republican side. New York elected a Democratic governor, but the following states went Republican: Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Kansas, Wisconsin, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Iowa, Ohio. The Republicans gained about 70 seats in Congress, and 8 new Senators.

New York re-elected Herbert Lehman as Governor by 67,506 plurality—Lehman 2,383,584, Tom

Dewey 2,316,078.

In Pennsylvania the Republican majority for Governor was around 300,000.

Democratic Gov. Murphy was defeated in Michigan by a large majority.

On the basis of Tuesday's election, the Democrats would have received 302 to 316 electoral votes out of a total of 531. The 302 electoral votes in the 35 states carried by Democrats without counting Indiana with 14 electoral votes and where returns are still incomplete, are much more than the 268 majority in the electoral college. But 302, or 316, is far below the 523 electoral votes received by Pres. Roosevelt in 1936 when he carried every state except Maine and Vermont.

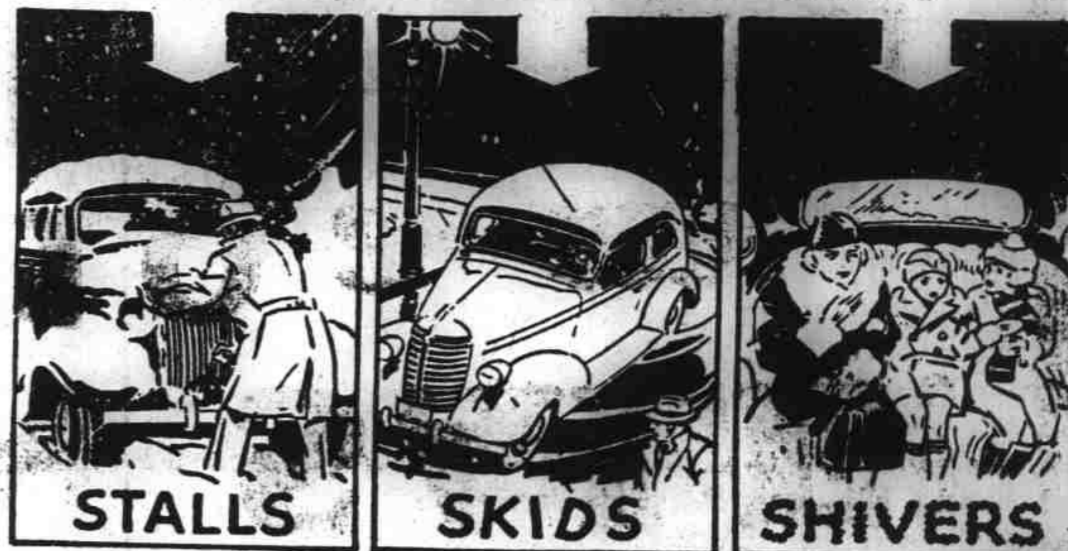
