Her father, Julius Blalock, was married a second time; and to this marriage there survives five children — all half-sisters and half-brothers of Miss Jennie; they are Cecil Blalock of Atlanta, Laurin Blalock of Hamlet, Mrs. John (Fannie) Austin of Tampa, Mrs. Richard (Eunice) Milham of Hamlet, Mrs. J. W. (Ruth) Hayes of Hamlet.

Mrs. Blalock, or Miss Jennie as so many affectionately called her, is survived by the above half-brothers, half-sisters, and by two children, John F. Blalock who served in the Navy two years, and married Adelaide Powell of Monroe Dec. 2, 1949, and they have two children, John Jr. and Julie Kay; and Miss Ella Virginia Blalock, registered nurse and now with the surgeons, Drs. Watters and Covington at their Clinic on Leak

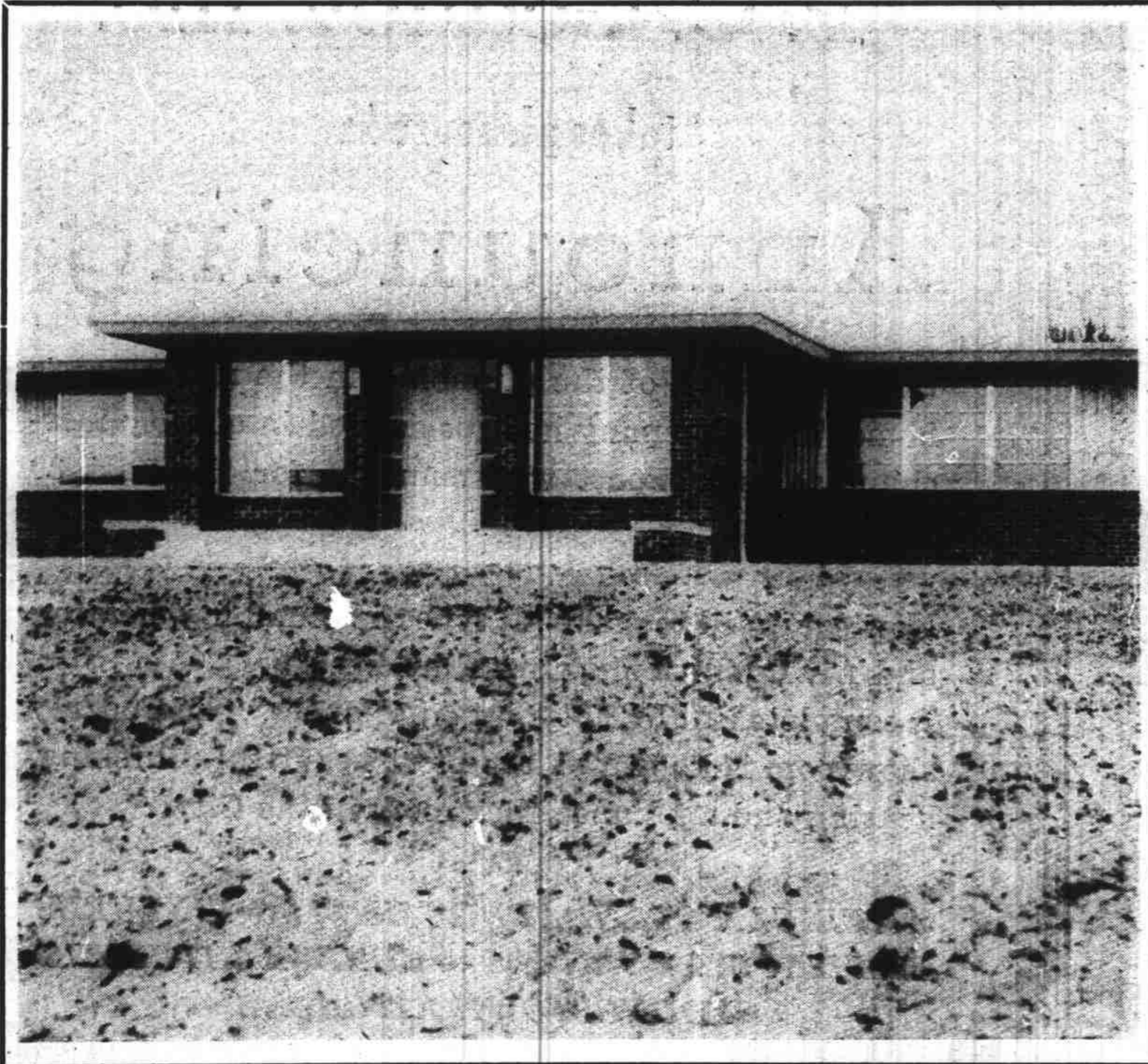
