The impressive service took place at 4:30 P. M. at Lowe's Grove Baptist church in Durham. The Rev. Robert Dorr was in charge of the ceremony.

Mrs. Frances Lunceford, organist and Donald Strickland, soloist rendered appropriate program prior to the service. Mr. Strickland sang "My Hero", "Whither Thou Goest", "O Lord Most Holy", and "The Lord's Prayer". The attendants entered the church by "Pomp and Circumstance" and the traditional wedding march was played only as the bride entered.
