TOWN ORDINANCES.

The Commissioners of the Town of Rutherfordton, do ordain:

1. That all persons living within the corporate limits of said town, liable by law to work on the public streets and roads, are hereby required to work on the streets and roads in said town, on each day of the week, or for part of each day, for each day that they may fail to work, to be sued for and recovered as other taxes and fines are: Provided, that the discretion of the Mayor, whose work may be rendered by substitute.

2. That any person or persons who shall engage in any trade, business, or profession, or who shall be guilty of unbecoming language, or shall curse or swear, to the annoyance of the citizens of said town, shall be fined, at the discretion of the Mayor, not to exceed twenty-five dollars.

3. That if any person shall discharge any fire-arms, except in cases of actual necessity, or by permission of the Mayor, within the corporate limits of said town, or in the streets or roads, or in any public place, or in the presence of children, or in any other place where it may be dangerous to the public, or where it may be a nuisance, or where it may be a source of annoyance to the citizens, or
