Here are found gold, silver, copper, iron, corundum, marble, and imbedded in these various minerals valuable gems such as are found nowhere else in this country. If I were going to raise cattle or sheep, I would go to this mountain region is as common as any word in the time. rather than to the far West. The climate is such that stock can live without shelter summer and winter. The most nutrituous grasses flourish in profusion, not only in the valleys. but even to the mountain summits ; so nutritious, that cattle feeding on the natural herbage during the summer months are in good condition for the market. Land is cheap. Yet the mineral wealth is largely undeveloped, and the resources of the land far from being exhausted.






