## Listing Property.

The list takers will soon be abroad that all property shall be listed in the month of June. This is a very important matter, and the people, to save themselves from trouble and additional expense, should bear these facts in mind.

Persons who shall fail to give in to the list-ta'er will have to list be- DR. W. L. STEELE, fore the Board of Commissioners (up to the second Monday in July), and are required by law to pay 25 cents for recording and five per centum on the regular amount of tax; and all persons who are liable for a poll tax and fail to give themselves in, and all who own property and fail to list it, by the second Monday in July, will be charged with double tax, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction, be fined or imprisoned.—Charlotte News.




