



> The Bulletin reckons the co.t f borax treatment, using ordinary commercial borax costing 5 to 6 cents per pound, to be one cent per horse per day, and recommends about a pound of borax to every 15 cubic feet or 12 bushels of manure immediately after its removal from the stable, or in other words, about a pound per horse per week. It further advises the sprinkling of the boras. through any fine sieve over the manure especially around the outer edges if placed in a pile and that the whole be sprinkled

with 3 to 5 gallons of water. While the State Board of Health would not for a moment frown on the use of borax where borax is necessary, or where for some reason prompt removal of manure seems out of the question, but attention should be called to the danger of trying to use some larvicide to the neglect of HENDERSON, N. C. ordinary cleanliness. In other words, beware of perfume where a bath is needed.
