The L. G. Shell Warehouse Burns Saturday

The warehouse buildings in the rear of the L. G. Shell Company's store were partially destroyed by fire on last Saturday afternoon. The origin of the fire is unknown but it developed quickly and located as it was in the midst of other buildings it looked for a while as though it might develop into a very dangerous fire.

Quick and efficient fire fighting work on the part of the Rosemary Manufacturing Company, who ran hose line promptly to the scene, and others who volunteered to aid in getting out the contents of the warehouse, held the blaze in check and extinguished it.

The loss was about twelve hundred and fifty dollars principally to the contents of the warehouse, consisting of hay and groceries of all kinds. Most of the loss was covered by insurance.
