For the Star. MESSRS. EDITORS: In a late number of our leading Agricultural journals. there is an article on David Dickson, of Georgia, who has amassed ian immense fortune by skill in farming.

Of course it is not to be expected that every farmer can be as successful as he has been, for every few have the same energy and practical good sense to apply to all the various departments of his pursuit; but if one-half is true that is said of him, we may take him for our model, and the nearer we do as he does the better for us.

One thing struck me very forcibly, in the article referred to, which is this, Mr. Dickson cultivates nearly double the quantity of land to the hand that farmers generally do.

This most important result is accomplished in a way that we can all imitate and a knowledge of it would be of great value to the farmers who read your paper.

It is done by deep plowing and shallow cultivating.

In the Spring he gives his land one deep and thorough plowing or breaking up, the cultivation of the crop is only on the surface of the ground, just deep enough to destroy the weeds and

It will be seen, at once, how much hard labor of man and horse can be saved by this method and that is not all, it is the best way, even if no labor were saved,

This is the great secret of his success in working twenty-five or thirty acres to the hand.

When the proper time comes for putting this knowledge into practice, let all your readers, who are farmers, remember it, and the saving they will make in labor will enable them casily to pay for their paper and a liberal contribution to the funds of an Agricultural society beside.

A TERRIBLE LEAP .- A fire occurred in Brooklyr, New York, on the 30th ult., in the white lead works of Prewin, Andrews & Douglas, Thomas Wallace, with his wife and child, occupied the upper part of the building. The fire commenced between the second and third floors and spread so rapidly that the escape of the family was cut off. In this emergency Wallace came to the desperate resolve of jumping from the third story to the ground. He took his child in his arms, and his wife's hand, and together they made the fearful leap. A horrible tragedy was perpetrated twelve miles from the city, on the Clarksville Pike, before day light Sunday morning. It was the murder of a wile and three children by a fiend in human shape, Jo. Barton, the husband and father.

Mrs. Barton and her children had retired to rest in the same bed, Saturday night, Barton being absent. Shortly after midnight, it is believed, Barton returned and cut their throats. The murder was not discovered until 10 6'clock Sunday marning, when a farmer, well acquainted with the family, passing on his way to church, observed the house fastened, no smoke issuing from the chimney, the windows closed and no sign of life. He went to the door and knocked. Again and again did he best upon the door, but no answer came. A mystericus stillness prevailed. He pried open the door and stood aghast at the dreadful spectacle which met his gaze. There lay the mother and the three little children in a great dark poot of blood which had run down from their lacerated throats toward the middle of the bed. The mother looked as though she had awakened from some terrible dream, and, have ing resisted as long as she was able, had sank down with her face turned toward her children, as if to avert the fate which awaited them. The children had evidently each been pulled down one by one in the bed and butchered beside their mother.
