George C. Van Buren, retired coal and grain business operator from Amsterdam, N. QUESTION: When should shrubs and seedlings be set out?
ANSWER: John H. Harris, extension horticultural specialist as State College, says any time between now and the last of March is a good time to do transplanting. Pick out a day when the soil isn't too wet. If your plants arrive when the soil is wet or frozen, keep them outdoors, open the package and pile soil, sawdust, or sand around the roots and keep this moist until they can be planted.

QUESTION: How much betterfat must a dairy cow produce each year to be profitable for her owner?
ANSWER: A summary of Dairy Herd Improvement Association records for 1950 shows that a dairy cow must be a high producer if she is to make money for her owner. The cow producing 200 pounds of butterfat for the year returned only \$126 above feed cost as compared to \$274 returned by the animal producing 300 pounds of butterfat. When production increased to 400 pounds, the return above feed cost jumped to \$391.

Dairy specialists at State College point out that this is an average increase of \$128 return over feed cost for each 100-pound increase in butterfat production. "From this," say the specialists, "we may expect an increased return of more than \$1 for each pound of butterfat increase. By increasing the production of our cows we can increase our returns."

A new pig chain has been started in Rutherford County by the Union Mills Grange, which brought three registered Hampshire gilt pigs to place with 4-H and FFA members.
