In addition to providing businessmen with credit information, the Credit Bureau also operates a collection agency for its subscribers. Members with delinquent accounts that they have not been able to collect are urged to turn these over to the bureau for collection. If the bureau is unable to get the delinquent customer to settle the account, legal action will be taken to judgement of the individual involved.

The bureau has been successful in most of its collection endeavors and seeks to get the delinquent accounts settled in a friendly manner, thus restoring the customer to good standing in the files of the bureau.

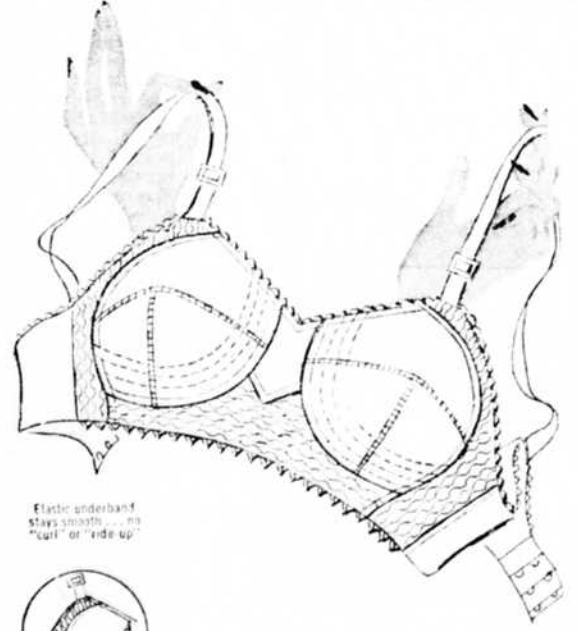
