ory. Mr. Tate pointed out to the stockholders at a general business meeting preceeding a banquet that the bank's net earnings for 1960 totalled \$288,579.19, a ten percent increase over 1959. He also reported that the banks gained \$2,500,000 in deposits in 1969, with the control of in 1960 without benefit of any bank mergers such as have been frequent in the Stafe in recent years. He noted that the Waccamaw Bank had had no mergers since 1937.
