

# Loris Voters Approve Bond Issue By 193-1, Tuesday

Loris citizens, by a vote of 193-1 Tuesday approved a proposed \$350,000.00 water and sewer bond issue that will make possible industrial expansion that could bring the Twin City Community a thousand new jobs next year.

The bond issue would allow the town to match federal funds and implement a \$700,000.00 water and sewerage expansion program that would:

- 1—Allow continued operation of the laundry of Community Hospital that soon will be called on to serve the \$250,000.00 Nursing Home now under construction;
- 2—Provide adequate fire protection for the \$100,000.00 plant now occupied by Loris Manufacturing Co., which is building toward a 300-employee payroll.
- 3—Allow Loris Industrial Developers, Inc. to construct a \$460,000.00 plant of 170,000 square feet for a wood working and metal working firm that would employ men of the Twin City Community of Loris and Tabor City;
- 4—Provide more adequate

fire protection for the old Loris Wood Products plant should it be re-opened; and

5—Provide adequate water and sewerage for all of the residential areas of town, half of which are now dependent on inadequate septic tanks.

Mayor H. C. Milligan and members of Town Council were elated both by the size of the total vote and by the overwhelming majority cast in favor of the bond issue.

"I can't help but wonder if that one vote against wasn't cast in error," Mayor Milligan said. "It's easy to make a mistake on a ballot where you strike the word 'No' in order to vote 'Yes!'"

Construction of the expanded water and sewer system is expected to begin in about four months and will provide a payroll of some \$280,000.00 for local labor.

Public Health Service has already approved a \$203,130.00 portion of the overall \$700,000.00 project and approval of the Community Facilities Administration and a grant of the balance of the federal government's share of the cost is ex-

pectable in a few days, Sen. Jim D. Johnston has told town officials.
