

December Most Dangerous Time For Pedestrian

December, with its holiday eason and busy shopping per-ed, is the most dangerous time of the year for persons travelet on foot, the State Highway Department advises,

Almost every year, pedes-trian deaths and injuries increase during the short day. and long nights of December. Reasons for the increase include greater pedestrian activity when persons are shopping darkness, pre-oc-upation with details of holiday preparations resulting in relaxed caution while walking, and greater ex-posure of children who try to queeze in a few hours of outdoor play between school and

Pedestrian fatalities in South Carolina annually average a-bout 20 per cent of the overall traffic death toll. Last year, 154 percess were killed while walking and 915 were injured. Larger percentages of pedestrain deaths occur among the age groups of the very young and the very old. During 1961, for example, 49 per cent of the persons under five years

Highway Department re-cords reveal that 59 per cent of the state's 1961 pedestrian ceath occurred while the vicims were crossing streets or highways between intersections. Crossing at intersections and standing in the roadway each accounted for seven per cent of the fatalities.


