The Sylva Township Road Com- ships are negotiating with the same capitalist for the sale of their road bonds, and will likely close a deal at once.

Mr. John Moody was in town yes terday and asked for a copy of our Road Law and said that River township was going to petition the county commissioners to allow their township to take advantage of this law and to build good roads in their township under the provisions of

Section 20. That the provisions of this act shall apply in all their force and effect to any township in Jackson county not specially named herein upon petition signed by a majority of the qualified voters of such township, and the board of county commissioners of Jackson county shall upon receiving such petition, appoint a board of road trustees for such township aforesaid of not less than five members (not more than four shall be chosen from any one political party) who shall organize and proceed to carry out the provisions of this act as is proherein Provided that that the bond ing under the provisions of this act shall not exceed the sum of thirty thousand dollars.

So the prospects for some good roads in Jackson are looking good, with the exception of the fight that bad road back to Webster that was taken off from the to wasathin and added to Sylva and Cullowhee, and thereby take from Sylva and Cullowhee, any jurisdiction of this stretch of road and in this way defeat the prospect of a good road from the railroad to the Cullowhee School.



In December 1905 it was necessary to have two small iron bridges built over Scott's Creek inside the corporate limits of the town of Sylwould not agree to build these bridges unless the town of Sylva would agree to pay half the cost.

This is a cut of the court house recently built at Marshall, Madison county, the construction of which cost \$26,000. Business men who Commissioners meeting Jan. 1, 1908 have seen this building say that it is one of the best up-to-date court houses in the state. The floor space of this building covers more than is being made to cut the 4 miles of half again as much ground than the present court house at Webster.

Mr. C. J. Harris has executed and filed with the clerk of the court a bond to construct a new court house agreeable with the specifications of the new court house at Marshall, and a new jail as good as the old one at Webster for a sum not exceeding \$30,000. Below we print a copy of the bond as filed. Also we print a statement signed by a majority of the building committee which explains itself. We are unable to reach the other three members of the committee in time for this issue o the Journal. However we are assured that their names can be had if necessary, by the next issue of this paper.

## Mr. Harris' Bond

In event the county-seat of Jackson county, N. C., is removed from Webster to Sylva, I agree to construct a new court house agreeable to the specifications of the new court house at Marshall (including vaults, heating arrangements, and wiring for electric lights if desired) and to construct a new jail as good as the old one at Webster, (cells from the old one to be used in the new one), for a sum not exceeding Thirty Thousand Dollars.
