The train bearing Secretary of State William Jennings Bryan and Mrs. Bryan and United States Senator Luke Lea, of Tennessee, to Asheville yeste day morning, ran over and instantly killed Miss Annie E. Williams, age 30, of Gainsville, Fla. It is said that her head was almost decapitated by the train, Southern No. 15. The accident occurred at Swannanoe, a few miles out on a

Miss Williams, who was a summer visitor, started across a small trestle, so it seems, just before hearing the train approaching, and a little boy her nephew, who was with the unfortunate young woman, drew back and was saved. The en ineer was prevented from seeing the young woman upon the trestle in time to stop the engine so it is having accounts against said estate claimed.

The body of Miss Williams was carried to a house 'earby and will be conveyed to her Florida home, Hobably today, for interment.

The story below is an account of the sad accident as told by the corresponden of the Asheville Citizen at Black Mountain.

OTHER DETAILS GIVEN.

Mountain, July pecial)—Miss Annie Williams was instantly killed by Southern railway train No 15 at 10 o'clock this morning near the depot at Swannanoa on train No 2: from Asnevine, having arrived there last night over the Carolina Special from her hom, in Gainsville, Fla. She was coming to the mountains in at effort to avoid the intense heat of her home and spend her annual vacation at the Harrison home at Swannoa.

Miss Williams left the depot and walked east on the track toward the boarding house and had reached the middle of a trestle, about three hundred yards from the depot, when the train came out of a cut a head of her with no warning except the roar of the engine. She Beninning on a black oak in my own had no time to jump before the woman was picked up by a train. crew under the trestle 20 feet below —Citizen.
