ing space in the daily and weekly pas pers to information as to the best farm methods. He suggested that each newspaper should be a booster for the Southeast as a whole and for its own particular community, not exaggerate ing or overstating advantages and opportunities, for the truth about the Southeast was good enugh. He suggested that newspaper men acting as correspondents of papers published in other localities should embrace every proper concitunity to incorporate in their news letters and despatches matter that would serve to attract favorable attention to their communities. Speaking of the exceptional opportunities for community development in the Southeast, Mr. Finley said:
